Vision, Mission, Objectives and Functions

Vision

To build a liquor abuse free society and eradication of drug abuse and addiction for ensuring a happy, peaceful, harmonious and prosperous society.

Mission

The Mission of the Excise & Narcotics Department is prevention of offences under the Mizoram Liquor Total Prohibition Act, '95, Mizoram Excise Act, 1973 Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act 1985 and Assam Drugs (Control) Act, 1950. Another mission of the department is to prevent illegal manufacture, possession, transport, import, export, sale, purchase, manufacture and consumption of liquor and illicit drugs.

Objective

- 1. Strengthening of enforcement activities, effective investigation and successful conduct of prosecution.
- 2. Improving of office management and E-Governance.
- 3. Campaign against liquor and drug abuse.
- 4. Strengthening of preventive machinery to eradicate illicit liquor and illicit drugs.

Functions

- 1. Collection of intelligence regarding the offences under various laws administered by the department.
- 2. Conduct intensive raids, detect cases and prompt action on complaints.
- 3. Speedy and time bound investigation of the cases registered and filing of charge or complaint before the Court of law.
- 4. Provide proper training to Excise & Narcotics personnel and other agencies for improvement of efficiency.
- 5. Better infrastructure for office functioning.
- 6. Introduction of new softwares.
- 7. Co-ordinating NGO's, Youth Organizations, and Local Self-Government etc. in the fight against drug abuse and alcoholism.
- 8. Campaign through print and electronic media.
- 9. Enforcement operations for preventing illicit liquor and drug.
- 10. Strengthening preventive machinery of the department.
- 11. Enhancement of duties and fees concerning the department.
- 12. Modernize the Department with communication facilities, arms, motor vehicles and other equipments.
